### PSC Visits The British Virgin Islands, April 2025

The Philadelphia Sailing Club travelled to the British Virgin Islands as part of their exotic trip program sailing from April 12 to April 19<sup>th</sup> of this year.

Whether a new sailor, an experienced sailor or just a sailor who is fulfilling his or her bucket list of adventures, there was something for everyone who sailed the BVIs.

Twenty four sailors manned 4 boats for an exhilarating time of food fun and fantasy. One couple celebrated their 50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary on the trip.

The group sailed from the island of Tortola on Choluta a Dufour 530 with 6 crew member, Fat Bottom Girl a Dufour 530 with 6 crew member, Reventador 2 a Dufour 470 with 6 crew and Oxygen a Sun Odyssey with 6 crew members. All in all, there were 24 sailors.

We anchored or moored out at Norman Island, our first destination and dined ashore, then travelled to Spanish Town. From Spanish Town, Virgin Gorda, we all took taxis to the world famous Baths. All four boats planned to sail to Anegada; two boats unable to reserve mooring balls, went to Saba Rock area instead. One boat took a sightseeing tour of Spanish Town after undergoing some repairs. The following day everyone went to Marina Cay. Our last night was spent at Jost Van Dyke where some of us went swimming in the Bubbly Pool.

BVIs offers a variety of attractions from the Indians and the Baths to the sunken ship the Rhone. Although the sailors did not snorkel the Indians, they did enjoy the Baths with its iconic boulders and pools. After an arduous journey, the group enjoyed dinner at each location except one ... After anchoring into the Bight, we all dinghied over to Willy T's in anticipation that we would enjoy drinks and food only to find out only drinks would be offered while we watched party goers jump off the floating restaurant and bar into the clear blue waters below. The ever ubiquitous drink the

These expenses are shared by all crew including ECMs and typically reconciled at the end of the trip. Cancellation fees are \$40 for weekends and \$75 for weeklong trips, if replaced. Trips will not be canceled nor refunds made unless cancellation and refund are made by vendor.

Member hereby releases the PSC, its officers, fellow members, fellow crew members, and the Experienced Crew Members ("ECM"), their heirs, administrators, successors, agents and assigns individually and jointly (hereafter "Released Parties") from any and all liability for property damage, personal injury (either physical or emotional), and/or death that may occur during Member's participation in any PSC events for any reason whatsoever, including specifically the carelessness, negligence, gross negligence and/or strict liability of any Released Party.

Member agrees that he/she will indemnify and hold harmless the Released Parties from any and all liability, actions, causes of actions, debts, claims and demands of every kind and nature whatsoever, which the Member now has or which he/she may have arising out of or in connection with his/her participation in any PSC events.

Member fully understands that the boat and equipment made available during PSC events come without any warranties, guaranties or other representations whatsoever by PSC or any of the Released Parties. Specifically, Member fully understands that the boat and equipment made available during PSC events DO NOT COME WITH ANY WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY AND/OR FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE from PSC or any of the Released Parties. Member agrees that he/she shall not rely on the judgment of any of the Released Parties when participating in PSC events.

Member assumes all of the risk of participation in PSC events with the full understanding that sailing can be a hazardous sport, including, but not limited to the risk that one or more of the Released Parties may cause property damage, personal injury (either physical or emotional) or death by their carelessness, negligence, gross negligence and/or strict liability.

Member assumes the responsibility to judge his/her fitness to participate in PSC events and his/her capabilities to face the risks and hazards inherent in any of the activities related to these events. Member further recognizes that he/she alone is responsible for his/her safety while participating in PSC events.

Member's signature hereon shall serve as a release, indemnification and assumption of the risk on behalf of Member, and his/her spouse, executors, administrators, Trustees, heirs, successors, agents, representatives, and assigns.

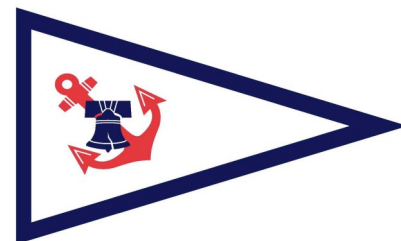

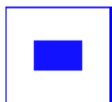
